

Artist-in-Residence - 2D Art: Central Michigan University and the Department of Art Barstow Artist-in-Residence program invite applications for a full-time, temporary position as Artist-in-Residence for the Fall 2010 and Spring 2011 semesters. Term of employment is August 16, 2010 through May 15, 2011.

The position includes a \$24,000 stipend with benefits and private housing surrounded by nature on the banks of the Chippewa River and designed by noted architect Stephen L. Barstow. The house provided for the Artist-in-Residence is located 15 miles from Mt. Pleasant and requires personal transportation to and from campus by the selected artist. The residency provides artists an opportunity to instruct while producing creative work within a collegial, scholarly environment. In return, CMU students are provided valuable access to educational opportunities outside of the existing curriculum and faculty.

Qualifications: The Artist-in-Residence Committee seeks an artist working with 2D art including, but not limited to, any of the following: painting, drawing, printmaking, photography, graphic design, mixed media and collage. Teaching experience at the university level is desired, but not required.

Responsibilities: Instructor of record for two classes each semester (one course will be a “special topics” course to be determined by the artist’s area of expertise and the other from within the art foundations area); provide public artist’s talk and solo exhibition; donate a piece of art to the Department of Art at the end of the residency.

Deadline: Position is open until filled, although priority is given to applications completed by January 4, 2010.
